



2019 JCS Annual Report

Dear JCS Family,

JCS serves tens of thousands of clients across more than 50 programs, representing nine core pillars ranging from Behavioral Health to Senior Services. JCS assists clients in every zip code in Miami-Dade County and provides services regardless of age, race, religion, national origin or sexual orientation. JCS continues to expand access to services for vulnerable populations through collaboration with funders and providers in our community.

Program Updates:

JCS 211 Miami

During the past year, JCS has expanded crisis and suicide prevention hotline services, providing weekend and after-hours coverage for Broward 2-1-1. Additionally, JCS is working in conjunction with the Florida Department of Veterans Affairs and the Crisis Center of Tampa Bay to provide a helpline where veterans can receive both emotional support and linkages to community resources. Furthermore, JCS' 211 Miami is the number one provider of suicide prevention services to the Latino community and has recently been selected to serve as one of the National Spanish Lifeline Centers. Lastly, JCS received the 2019 AIRS (Association of Information and Referral Services) Innovation of the Year Award for Information & Referral Organizational Effectiveness.

Holocaust Survivor Services

The Claims Conference has dramatically increased its grant award (\$14 mil) to JCS, which has enabled us to expand services to the Survivor community. The grant draws down \$20 for every dollar of required local match.

School-Based Services

JCS entered into a contract with the Miami Dade Public Schools to provide students and their families with counseling, mental health consultation, screenings and assessments. JCS also entered into a subcontract with the University of Miami to provide assessment and referral services for children in Jump Start Early Childhood programs throughout the County, a multi-year award funded through The Children's Trust.

Disaster Relief

JCS engaged in a contractual relationship with Compass 82, a trusted resource for hurricane recovery solutions, to provide disaster case management services to meet the needs of Hurricane Irma survivors in an effort to define and achieve realistic goals for their recovery and facilitate access to a variety of needed services.

Building Community Resilience

JCS was awarded a one year, one-time \$50,000 grant from New York Life to expand school-based trauma-related counseling services in the Liberty City community.

In 2020, JCS will celebrate its 100th year anniversary and we look forward to our kick-off event on November 9, 2019. Through the years, JCS has been an integral part of the social services safety net for our community. As the human service needs of the Miami-Dade community continues to change and grow, we are confident that JCS will continue to lead the way in meeting those needs in an effort to improve the quality of life for children and families.

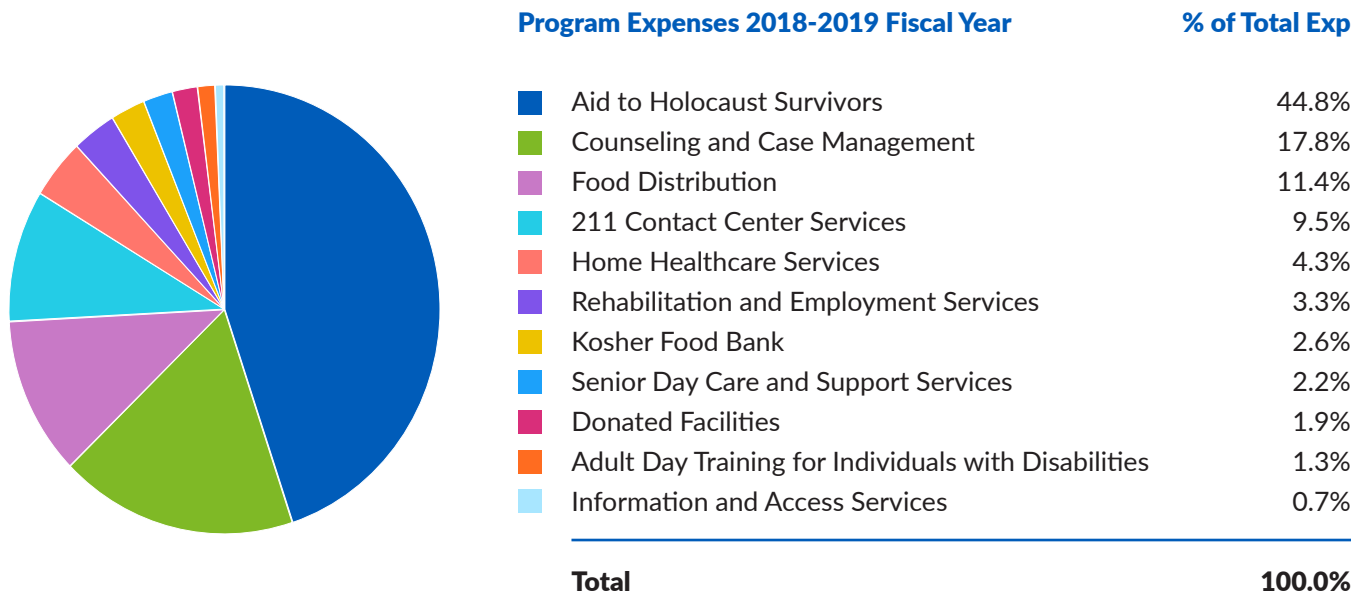
