# 2022-2023: JCS: SOARING TO NEW HEIGHTS IN COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT AND SERVICE

As we reflect on the past year, we are heartened by the outpouring of support and confidence of our community, and its generosity. We are inspired and humbled by the support of hundreds of volunteers, treasured partnerships across the our vibrant community, the amazing professional team and our treasured partners who make our strong and resilient safety net of services possible.

We are grateful to our Board of Directors, professional team, over 600 active volunteers, and our investors for bringing our mission to life: *Improve the quality of life and self-sufficiency of the Jewish and broader communities throughout South Florida in accordance with Jewish values.* Our South Florida community is a beautifully diverse mosaic comprised of individuals of a broad array of backgrounds and abilities. While many community members have thrived over the last year, many others have not. Impacted by ever-increasing socio-economic and physical and emotional stressors, the number of frail and vulnerable community members requiring support to become self-sufficient, improve their quality of life and to age with dignity has increased dramatically. The Jewish Community Services

of South Florida (JCS) team of diverse, culturally strong professionals has the privilege of providing a safety-net of caring and compassionate services to address these needs. They make our work in service to residents and their families possible.

We are so very proud to serve with world class talent in social and health services as well as human resources, technology, facilities and fiscal operations. Specializing in food, family-strengthening, mental health, case management and information & referral programs, our culturally competent direct services team is dedicated to meeting the unique needs of each client. Over the past three years, our agency and JCS Board of Directors continue on a path of a transformation as we scale to new heights in quality service delivery consistent with the JCS Strategic Plan.

This year has seen significant growth in our presence in schools (public and private), with significant expansion into religious day schools. We are proud of the strength of the successful community-wide partnerships between JCS, Miami-Dade County, Miami-Dade County Public Schools, and The Children's Trust for the More Summer Camp Choices and More After School Choices initiatives.

J-RAP (JCS Refugee Assistance Program) has now assisted in resettlement and care coordination for over 600 refugees from Afghanistan and Ukraine. A recent expansion to serve the full tri-county area (a first for JCS), allows us to serve Cuban and Haitian parolees, and unaccompanied minors, in partnership with the Hebrew Immigrant Aid Society, Jewish Federations of North America, Greater Miami Jewish Federation, and the Sheppard Broad, Shapiro and Kovner Foundations.

The requirement of enhanced services to our treasured Holocaust Survivor and senior clients has continued to increase to unprecedented levels. JCS professionals continue to address these needs in order to ensure clients are able to live with the dignity, respect and care they deserve even with dire economic stressors coupled with re-traumatization due to the Ukraine war world events that are so easily viewed through social media as well as social isolation.

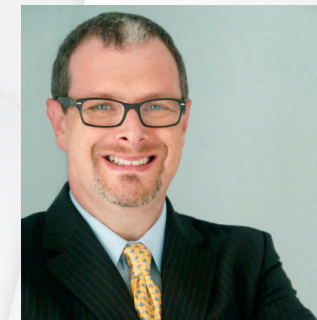

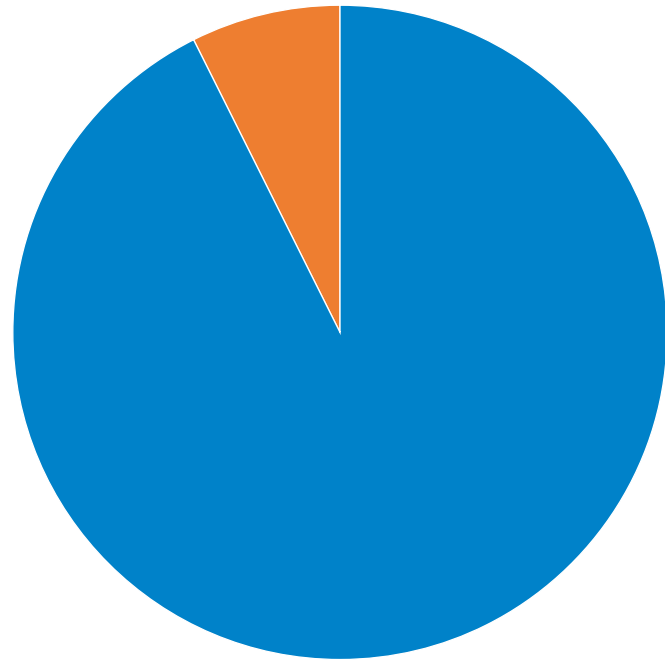

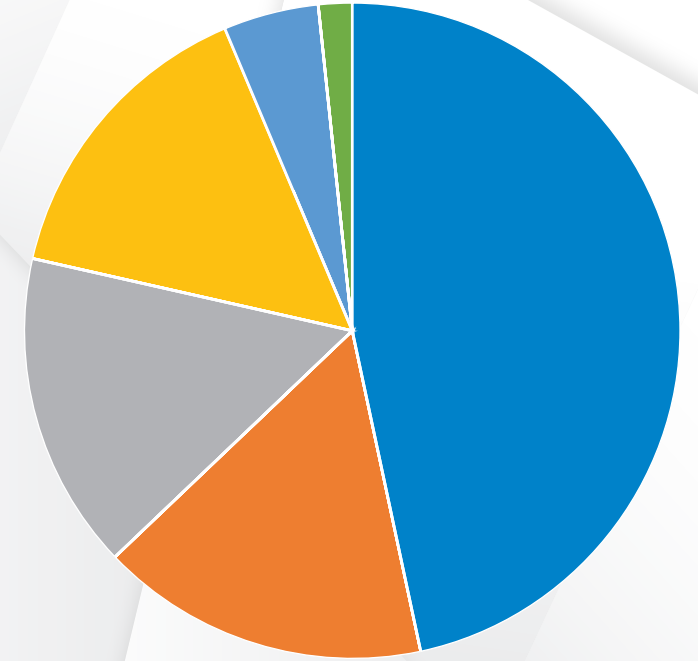
